### Vegetables

Qualifying exhibits will be displayed in the Wiser Horticulture Pavilion during the week of the fair. **Entry forms may be submitted to the Fair Office in advance to expedite check-in; however, advance submission is not required. Exhibits and any associated paperwork (if not previously submitted) must be delivered on the Tuesday prior to the opening of the fair between 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.** Exhibits must be picked up on the Sunday following the final day of the fair between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. *Please bring your exhibit tags at the time of pick-up.*

#### **Rules and Regulations:**

1. All vegetable exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor on land occupied by the exhibitor as owner or renter.
2. Exhibitors must identify all varieties entered. Judges may withhold awards for any entries that are not accurately or properly identified.
3. Unless otherwise specified, only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in each class.
4. Vegetables that are blemished, damaged, or frozen shall not be eligible for entry and will not be considered by the judges. No award shall be made to any exhibit that does not meet the standard of merit as determined by the judges.
5. Exhibitors must indicate the appropriate division on the entry form: Adult or Youth (ages 4–15).
