### Floriculture

Qualifying exhibits will be displayed in the Wiser Horticulture Pavilion during the week of the fair. **Entry forms may be submitted to the Fair Office in advance to expedite check-in; however, advance submission is not required. Exhibits and any associated paperwork (if not previously submitted) must be delivered on the Tuesday prior to the opening of the fair between 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.** Exhibits must be picked up on the Sunday following the final day of the fair between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Please bring your exhibit tags at the time of pick-up.

#### Rules and Regulations:

1. All Floriculture exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor on land owned or rented by the exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors must identify all varieties entered. Judges may withhold awards for any entries that are not accurately or properly identified.
3. Unless otherwise specified, only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in each class.
4. Containers for cut flowers only will be provided by the Fair.
5. Potted and/or container-grown plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for a minimum of 60 days prior to entry.
6. All cut flowers must include attached foliage unless otherwise specified.
7. After judging, exhibitors must replace flowers that deteriorate in quality. Replacements may be made before 9:00 a.m. each day of the Fair and Rodeo; otherwise, entries may be removed by the Superintendent.
8. Exhibitors must indicate the appropriate division on the entry form: Adult or Youth (ages 4–15).

## Division 126 — Roses

**One bloom or stem per entry** is required. Roses must be exhibited with a healthy stem and attached foliage. Blooms should be staged at approximately one-third to one-half open. Please name the variety if known.

## Division 127 — Gladiolus

**One spike is required per entry**. Spikes should be straight and include at least one leaf. Blooms should be staged with approximately one-third buds, one-third partially open blooms, and one-third fully open blooms.

### Class Numbers:

2. Small Bloom — 2 ½ - 3 ½ inches in diameter
3. Medium Bloom — 3 ½ - 4 ½ inches in diameter
4. Large Bloom — 4 ½ - 5 ½ inches in diameter

## Division 128 — Dahlias

**One bloom is required per entry**, any color. Dahlias must include at least two leaves and have no buds present. The center should be visible only in single and collarette varieties. Please name the variety if known.

## **Division 133 — *Patio and Porch Mixed Plants***

*Exhibits **must be in movable containers**; maximum weight limit 30 lb.*

### **Class Numbers:**

1. Artistic Planting — 5 or more plants in one pot, at least 12 inches in diameter. Use of novelty containers and appropriate accessories is encouraged. May be hanging or freestanding.
2. Novel Container — Planting in a very novel or unusual container of any size. May include foliage, flowers, vines, or shrubs. Judged on plant condition and creative use of container.
3. Window Box Planter — Any planting suitable for a window box, must not exceed 30 inches in length. Must be stable for sitting or hanging. Use of hanging or flowing plants with color, fragrance, or a theme (such as English Garden) is encouraged.
4. Plant Collection — A planting of named specimens in one container, such as cacti, succulents, or petunias.

## **Division 134 — *Artistic Arrangements***

*All arrangements must use fresh flowers and/or foliage. Materials may be grown or purchased from a florist.*

### **Class Numbers:**

#### **Fresh Flowers:**

1. Fair Theme Interpretation — Fair Theme Arrangement
2. America the Beautiful — Arrangement displaying a patriotic theme
3. A Garden's Friends — Inspired by birds, bees, dragonflies, and ladybugs

## **Division 135 — *Ornamental Grasses***

*Entrant **must name the variety**. Classes may be divided into subclasses if three or more of the same named grass are entered.*

### **Class Numbers:**

1. Cut Ornamental Grass — Named variety; bunch secured with string or rubber band in a 1-inch diameter clump (or larger if blades are large). Include any flowers if present; otherwise exhibit foliage only. Judging based on condition, including absence of holes, rust, or pests.
2. Potted Ornamental Grass — Named variety; any pot size permitted, including nursery or decorative containers. Container must be clean for presentation. Remove any dead or damaged foliage.
3. Collections — Two or more varieties planted in a single container.

## **Division 136 — Succulents and Cacti**

Entrant ***must name the variety***. Exhibits must be in movable containers; maximum weight limit 30 lb. Exhibitor may have up to three entries in Class 12. If Class 12 has 3 or more of the same variety, the superintendent may establish a separate class for that variety.
