Crops

Qualifying exhibits will be displayed in the Wisser Horticulture Pavilion during the week of the fair. **Entry forms may be submitted to the Fair Office in advance to expedite check-in; however, advance submission is not required. Exhibits and any associated paperwork (if not previously submitted) must be delivered on the Tuesday prior to the opening of the fair between 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.** Exhibits must be picked up on the Sunday following the final day of the fair between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. *Please bring your exhibit tags at the time of pick-up.*

Rules and Regulations:

1. All crop exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor on land owned or rented by the exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors must identify all varieties entered. Judges may withhold awards for any entries that are not accurately or properly identified.
3. Unless otherwise specified, only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in each class.
4. Grains and seeds are primarily grown for milling or seed purposes and shall be judged accordingly. All grains and seeds will be evaluated based on varietal characteristics, as well as freedom from foreign matter, weed seeds, dirt, etc.
5. Exhibitors must indicate the appropriate division on the entry form: Adult or Youth (ages 4–15).

Division 100 — Grains

Exhibitor may have up to three separate entries in each class.

Class Numbers:

1. Threshed Grain — 1 quart wide-mouthed jar
2. Sheaf Grain — 4-inch diameter (stripping not necessary)

Division 101 — Grasses & Legumes for Seed

All entries may be any variety unless otherwise noted. Seeds must be exhibited in one quart wide-mouthed jar.

Class Numbers:

Division 102 — Specialty Seeds

Seeds must be exhibited in a half-pint jar.

Fruits and Nuts

Qualifying exhibits will be displayed in the Wiser Horticulture Pavilion during the week of the fair. **Entry forms may be submitted to the Fair Office in advance to expedite check-in; however, advance submission is not required. Exhibits and any associated paperwork (if not previously submitted) must be delivered on the Tuesday prior to the opening of the fair between 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.** Exhibits must be picked up on the Sunday following the final day of the fair between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. *Please bring your exhibit tags at the time of pick-up.*

Rules and Regulations:

1. All crop exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor on land owned or rented by the exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors must identify all varieties entered. Judges may withhold awards for any entries that are not accurately or properly identified.
3. Unless otherwise specified, only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in each class.
4. Fruits and Nuts are primarily grown for fresh use, culinary purposes, or preservation and shall be judged accordingly. All entries will be evaluated based on varietal characteristics, maturity, appearance, and overall quality, as well as freedom from defects, decay, insect damage, and foreign matter.
5. Exhibitors must indicate the appropriate division on the entry form: Adult or Youth (ages 4–15).
